It was this year in January, when the P.L.E results of 2024 were released. Many candidates became anxious because they wanted to know their results. Therefore, they sent <u>sms</u> to 6600 at a cost of five hundred shillings.

While releasing the results, the Minister of Education and Sports Honourable Janet Kataaha Museveni was glad to announce that most of the candidates had passed the examination and that there was improvement in general performance.

Urban schools had performed relatively better than rural schools. The Minister cautioned teachers in rural areas against absenteeism, late coming and high rate of drunkardness. She promised that the Ministry of Education would come up with a new policy very soon to regulate teachers' attendance.

Finally, the Minister asked parents to take up responsibilities for their children's education. The minister further said, "When children are educated, they do not only support their parents but also positively contribute to national development".
