Item 1: Map Skills.

For this item use the East Africa 1:50,000 (UGANDA) LUKAYA map extract series Y732 sheet 79/2 Edition 3 USD, the information in the text below, support materials provided and answer the tasks given

a) A prominent Chinese investor approached the authorities in Lukaya in search of an area where he would set up a project for rice growing. He obtained a lease on an area extending from easting 760 to 830 and between northing 820 to 880. The authorities requested him to pay shs. 40 million for a square kilometer of land. However the environmentalists in the region were angered by the authorities decision and they wanted to block the move.

Task:

- i) Calculate the total amount of money that the investor paid to the authorities.
- ii) Why did the environmentalists oppose the decision by the authorities to lease the land to the investor?
- b) The resident in Lukaya area depend on climate to carryout activities such as crop cultivation, livestock rearing, fishing, transport and trade. However they have limited knowledge about the climatic elements in the area and sometimes they incur loses in their activities. The meteorological department conducted a survey and obtained climatic information for Lukaya.

Item 2: Photograph Skills.

Study the photograph taken from a mining area in east Africa and the text below it.



The government has discovered a valuable mineral resource in the area shown on the photograph and has licensed a mining company to exploit the mineral. The government wants to use the proceeds from the mining activity to pay external debts and provide social services to the people. The area has a river and natural woodland which doubles as a wildlife conservation centre. One of the local newspapers has instructed its staff to interact with the people of the area and establish the concerns of those opposed to the project.



Item 5


