Mr. Mushabe is one of the most outstanding cattle keepers. He owns a very large herd of cattle. He rears more cows than the bulls. This is because his major aim is to get milk which he supplies to Katwe dairies. Mr. Mushabe has employed people who care for his cattle. He has a herdsman who looks after them. He also has a milkman. The milkman's duty is to milk the cows and take the milk to the dairies. In order to keep his cattle from disease attacks, Mr. Mushabe also employs a veterinary doctor on part time basis. He treats the cattle from their kraals and occasionally takes them for dipping.

Kazo village also has another prominent animal keeper. She is Mrs. Sabuni. She rears sheep and goats. The sheep and goats are kept in their pens or folds where they **dwell** . They are grazed on a large piece of land at free range. The shepherd looks after the sheep while the goat herd looks after the goats. The sheep are kept for mutton while the goats are kept for their delicious goat meat.

The village is **famous** all over the country for its animal products.

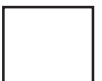
