Last week, our class visited a post office at 10:00am. We travelled by a minibus. When we reached the post office, we were welcomed by Mrs. Opi. Our teacher Mr. Mbabazi, introduced us to Mrs. Opi.

Mrs. Opi told us that the post office offers many services. For examples, she said it helps people to communicate with one another. People send and receive letters, parcels, money and telegrams through the post office. Letters and parcels are either registered or not.

"Even love letters?" Apio interrupted, sending everyone into wild laughter. After the laughter had died to a few giggles, Mrs. Opi said that the post office receives all kinds of letters. But she quickly cautioned us against getting involved in romantic relationships at our age.

The post office has post-boxes which have numbers. Each user has a special post office box number. Letters and small parcels are put in each post-box. This is where the owners get them from. The post office receives rental fees from each user. This is paid only once a year.

We were shown stamps which are stuck on letters to be sent by the post office. The stamps had very exciting photos, especially those that had tropical plants. Each stamp has an amount of money. Unless the letter has a stamp, it cannot be posted. When you buy a stamp, then you have paid money for the postage of your letter. The letters to be posted are put in a letter slot. "You will soon see some people come to post letters through the slot," Mrs. Opi said.

"What are these pretty papers?" Tinka pointed.

"Those are called aerogrammes," Mrs. Opi answered. "They are special papers you write on and fold without putting in an envelope. You only buy a stamp."

"What is that big book?" Hadijah inquired.

"That is the Post Office Directory," said Mrs. Opi. "Who can tell us what is in that book?" Mrs. Opi asked.

The pupils learnt that addresses of people, schools, companies and the others are found in the directory.

"What is the difference between private box and a telegram?" asked Wakisa while smiling.

"A private box is where people without post-boxes get their letters and parcels. A telegram is a special way of sending a message quickly through electrical signals."

"Is it like a money order?" Wakisa inquired again. "No, a money order is a special form you fill in so as to send someone money," Mrs. Opi answered

Mr. Mbabazi thanked Mrs. Opi for the information given to the class about the post office. We, the primary five Blue's gave a vote of thanks to the team and boarded our minibus back to Alua Primary School.


