ITEM 1

An investor who plans to establish a crop farm on large scale in BULISA area under irrigation farming has failed to locate the right place where he will supply and distribute water to the area shown on the map by gravitational flow and he needs your help.

TASK: a) As a geographer , help him to solve the problem with a reason.

b) Using an illustration of a reduced map of BULISA by 50%, describe the geography of the area to the investor while considering the major features.

c) River Sambiye is likely to disorganize the gardens according to the investor especially to flooding into the farmland. Help him to determine the direction of flow of the river for proper management.

d) Rumors reaching the investor's table indicate that the people of Bulisa are worried of being displaced when the investor's farming project starts. The investor has not taken the rumors for granted and so he is considering getting a solution to the concerns of the locals. However he lacks the knowledge on the pattern of settlement of the people in the area.

The nature of the landscape in these regions has led to a lot of questions about their origin by the community members.

ITEM 4

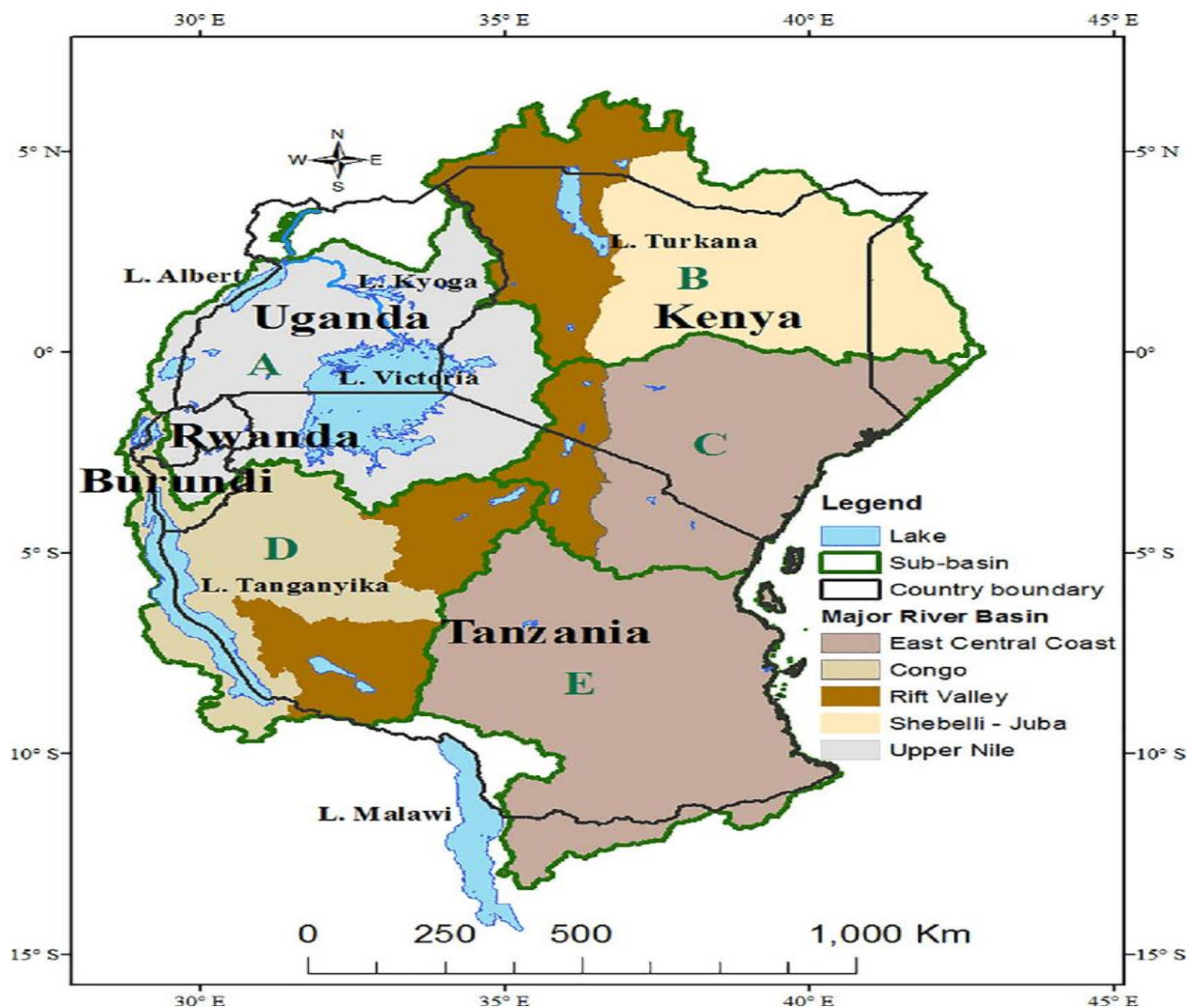
Focusing mainly in east Africa but specifically in Uganda, You and your classmates have been selected to participate in a national Geography Challenge organized by the Ministry of Water and Environment. As part of the competition, your team is given a mission to design an eco-tourism route for international visitors interested in Uganda's water bodies. Your journey begins at **Lake Victoria**, then moves

northwards along the **Victoria Nile**, through **Lake Kyoga**, and continues all the way to **Lake Albert**. Along the way, you also pass by **River Kafu** and **River Katonga**. ITEM 5

In East Africa, a certain percentage of people have been resisting the excessive involvement of the Chinese in the infrastructure sector. However, the elite class of the East Africans has expressed the need to welcome and support the Chinese especially in the role they play in infrastructure.

Task. a) You have been invited to educate these communities that have been resisting the Chinese to accept and welcome them with a positive attitude, write a document that you will present when you meet them.

b) the parliamentary committee on infrastructure in your country is yet to hold a debate on a topic 'Develop the transport network to achieve economic transformation'. Prepare a document that will guide both parties assuming your country is under a multi-party system of governance.

ITEM 6

China has increasingly invested in the trade sector with most African countries. The Chinese goods such as electronics, footwear, gadgets, fabrics among others have over flooded many African countries with unbalanced trade. According to UNCTAD, in 2022 Uganda imported 5500 tonnes electronics, 15000 tonnes of mobile phones, 8800 tonnes of fabrics and 4700 tonnes of motorcycles. In 2024 5000 tonnes of electronics, 10000 tonnes of mobile phones, 7000 tonnes of fabrics and 3500 tonnes of motorcycles.

c) why should Uganda continue herself in trade with other countries despite the unbalanced terms of trade?

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
