

- c) Using the information in the table provided and the text, write an article to be published in the newspaper that will help the Kenyans deal with the concerns of the members in the community.


ITEM 6

Uganda is a member of numerous international organizations, such as the IGAD, COMESA, and EAC etc. The country is open to foreign trade, which accounts for 35% of its GDP according to World Bank. Uganda mainly exports coffee, fish, beans and legumes and others whereas imports are led by petroleum, medicaments, road vehicles, and plastics, iron and steel and others. Uganda exports with U.A.E, China, Japan, India, USA, UK and some other African countries..

In 2022, exports of good decreased to USD 3.9b from 4.1b while imports reached USD 9.3b. This imbalance in trade has threatened members in your community because they don't know how to support the government making Uganda's trade balance being structurally in deficit.
