For this item use the **EAST AFRICA** 1:50,000 (UGANDA) Map Extract of **NYARWEYO** series Y72, sheet 48/4, EDITION 1.U.S.D and the text provided to answer the tasks given.

- (a) A local investor wanted to buy land equivalent to the area of Mpongo permanent swamp East of Easting 11 to start up a project. The cost of land in the area is 5,000/= per square kilometer. Determine the amount of money the investor will need to buy the land. (02 scores)
- (b) As a learner of geography, help the people of Nyarweyo to describe the geography of the area. (03 scores)
- (c) If a resident at the secondary trigonometrical station west of Kisita wants to get water from the bore hole at Kadebede. Guide Ife to locate the bore hole.

- (d) The residents of Nyarweyo living in the area south of Northing 35 carry out a number of activities. The local investor together with the out growers want to extend their ginneries and cotton growing activities to increase production. However the North Eastern area is not easily accessed due to ridges and absence of transport routes.

The local community has therefore requested to the authorities to extend their activities to the central and eastern region which the local authorities think will negatively affect the swamp and forests hence they have decided to call for a meeting.
