#### Task


- a) Apart from tree planting and brick laying, educate Okee and other residents on the opportunities that they can tap in this area.

#### Item 4.

Uganda is often referred to as the pearl of Africa endowed with a number of rivers, Lakes and swamps. These drainage features play a significant role in the economic development in the different communities where they exist.
